Law in the Era of Technological Change

Today, more than ever, rapidly changing technology permeates nearly every aspect of our lives. Technological advances pose complex and critical questions in a broad array of legal fields at a pace that, more often than not, surpasses that of legal change. Emerging technologies have implications on overlapping areas such as intellectual property, data protection, privacy rights, electronic commerce, biotechnology, free speech, Internet governance, and cybercrime. What are the legal challenges raised by autonomous cars? Should there be a 'right to be forgotten' in cyberspace? Should online platforms and intermediaries be liable for users' acts? How should we rethink civil liberties in the context of the rise of facial recognition technologies and the proliferation of drones? These are, amongst others, some of the exciting legal dilemmas that lie at the intersection of law and technological change.

We welcome submissions in all fields of law from graduate (particularly, Ph.D. level) students. Submissions are not bound by the topic of the conference, but preference will be given to papers that address related issues.

Please send an **abstract of your paper** (500 words max.) and a **short bio** (100 words max.), in English, to cglrc2017@gmail.com. Católica will sponsor the accommodation of successful applicants for the duration of three nights (September 20, 21 and 22) in a hotel close to campus.

The deadline for submission of abstracts and bios is **May 20**.

Successful applicants will be informed by no later than **June 1**.

Final papers will be due by no later than **September 1**. Subject to peer review, final papers will have the possibility to be published in *Católica Law Review*.
